

Assessing Parent Supports in Your Community

Every community has people and groups that support our families. Survey data will help you find the people in your county or Triple P region who parents interact with for information, support, and advice related to parenting.

This toolkit guides us in:

- Using strategies to decide what population is of interest
- How to engage this population's stakeholders in the assessment process
- Recruiting parents and caregivers to participate in the survey

Knowing more about parent supports can strengthen **reach**, **connections and collaboration** between parents, caregivers, and the community-based groups who collectively work together to improve the well-being of kids and families in your community.

This toolkit provides resources to guide co-creation of a parent support assessment process with Triple P teams, Implementation Support Specialists, and caregivers. It has 4 main components:

- Social Network Analysis (guide to share with LIAs and community partners interested in knowing more about how survey data and social network analysis may benefit implementation)
- Caregiver Recruitment Examples (tools to help community partners disseminate a parent support survey to caregivers)
- Parent Support Survey (link to an electronic caregiver survey)
- **Powerpoint** (to explain the project to a potential community partner(s))

Steps for Impact Center and LIA co-creation:

- 1. Implementation Specialist(s) partner with LIA
- 2. Discuss what an LIA might learn via a parent survey (see *Social Network Analysis* tool)
- 3. Choose a population with a known need to survey (tool pending)
- 4. Gather buy-in from leaders in that population (see *Powerpoint*)
- 5. Share recruitment materials and survey link (see *materials and link*)
- 6. Offer regular updates on survey response
- 7. Implementation team analyzes data (tool pending)
- 8. Full team reviews data and discusses application (tool pending)
- 9. Team presents data to leaders and caregivers and discusses application
- 10. Handoff to LIA with support and consultation as needed

Social Network Analysis

SNA can help identify key connectors and supporters in your community. SNA tells you the people in your county or Triple P region that parents interact with for information, advice and support related to parenting.

What is a Social Network?

A network is a group of people that interact, either in person or virtually, around similar interests, activities, or relationships and who share information or advice.



What is Social Network Analysis?

SNA starts with collecting survey data from families to identify (1) where parents and caregivers access information regarding parenting and (2) important people who support families in the community.

The connections among families and key supports in the community are then illustrated on a 'parenting support network' map to show how people interact and the nature of those relationships.



The network map shows individuals that are highly connected, those that are more isolated and reciprocity among relationships and individuals. A network map can also show us how dense an entire network may be. Through this analysis, we can identify additional opportunities to collaborate with key individuals, share information, and link people to available resources.

How can Social Network Analysis Benefit LIAs?

While SNA shows who and how individuals in a parenting support network interact, you as the LIA would act on this information by creating, strengthening, or maintaining partnerships and social connections.

By identifying key connectors and supports in your community and better understanding how and where families go for parenting support, LIAs can use the network maps to:



• Identify potential members to invite to your Coalition/CLT



Identify key community members for outreach and referral networks



 Leverage existing knowledge and expertise within your community to better support families.




